noted scholar & director emeritus of the Cornell Fine Arts Museum at Rollins College

EUSTIS, Fla.: Noted art historian and museum professional, **Dr. Arthur Blumenthal**, will be conducting his popular one-day workshop "HOW TO LOOK AT ART!" at the Lake Eustis Museum of Art on Saturday, March 9, from 10 am to 4 pm. The tuition is \$45, or \$40 for LEMA members. This covers a full day of personal instruction in the galleries, snacks, coffee, and all instructional material. Enrollment is limited to 25 people.

HOW TO LOOK AT ART! is a fun, transformational, and interactive workshop that has been offered at major North American museums. Developed by Dr. Blumenthal after decades of watching viewers struggle with art, the non-lecture, participatory course embraces "Slow Looking," meticulous description, humor, and insightful thinking using the participant's own visual powers. On Saturday, March 9, Dr. Blumenthal will be utilizing artworks in the LEMA exhibition, "HE SHE WE: Doug Hays & Brenda Heim" (on view March 8 to April 28). In this exhibition, metal sculptor Doug Hays and abstract expressionist painter Brenda Heim combine talents to create new and exciting possibilities in art.

HOW TO LOOK AT ART! has been offered at the Vero Beach Museum of Art, the Museum of Arts & Sciences in Daytona Beach, the National Art Gallery of the Bahamas in Nassau, and the Ringling Museum of Art in Sarasota among many other national and international locations. More than 1,000 students have enjoyed this class since 1988. Dr. Blumenthal, an international museum consultant and popular art educator, is Director Emeritus of the Cornell Fine Arts Museum at Rollins College and the 2007 recipient of the Florida Art Museum Directors Association's Lifetime Achievement Award.
